Section 5. The Illinois Highway Code is amended by changing
Section 9-113.02 as follows:

Sec. 9-113.02. Damage to State-owned or local government-owned roadway property; highway and highway property.

(a) Any agency or instrumentality of the State of Illinois 10 11 or unit of local government may seek recovery for the cost of 12 the repair or replacement of damaged or destroyed roadway property. As used in this Section, "roadway property" includes 13 14 road safety equipment and emergency equipment. Depreciation may not be used as a factor in determining the cost of the 15 16 damaged or destroyed roadway property for which recovery is 17 sought.

18 (b) Any agency or instrumentality of the State of Illinois 19 or unit of local government may seek recovery for the cost of 20 the repair of damaged or destroyed highways, highway 21 structures, or traffic-control devices that result from 22 operating, driving, or moving a truck tractor-semitrailer 23 combination exceeding 55 feet in overall dimension authorized

12 <u>(4) The distance between the kingpin and the center</u> 13 <u>axle of a semitrailer longer than 48 feet, in combination</u> 14 <u>with a truck tractor, may not exceed 42 feet 6 inches. The</u> 15 <u>limit contained in this paragraph (4) shall not apply to</u> 16 <u>trailers or semitrailers used for the transport of</u> 17 livestock as defined by Section 18b-101.

Vehicles operating during daylight hours when transporting 18 poles, pipes, machinery, or other objects of a structural 19 20 nature that cannot readily be dismembered are exempt from length limitations, provided that no object may exceed 80 feet 21 22 in length and the overall dimension of the vehicle including 23 the load may not exceed 100 feet. This exemption does not apply to operation on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday. Legal 24 25 holidays referred to in this Section are the days on which the 26 following traditional holidays are celebrated: New Year's Day;

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Memorial Day; Independence Day; Labor Day; Thanksgiving Day;
 and Christmas Day.

Vehicles and loads operated by a public utility while en route to make emergency repairs to public service facilities or properties are exempt from length limitations, provided that during night operations every vehicle and its load must be equipped with a sufficient number of clearance lamps on both sides and marker lamps on the extreme ends of any projecting load to clearly mark the dimensions of the load.

10 A tow truck in combination with a disabled vehicle or 11 combination of disabled vehicles, as provided in paragraph (6) 12 of subsection (c) of this Section, is exempt from length 13 limitations.

14 All other combinations not listed in this subsection (b) 15 may not exceed 60 feet overall dimension.

16 (c) Except as provided in subsections (c-1) and (c-2), 17 combinations of vehicles may not exceed a total of 2 vehicles 18 except the following:

19

(1) A truck tractor semitrailer may draw one trailer.

20 (2) A truck tractor semitrailer may draw one converter
 21 dolly or one semitrailer.

(3) A truck tractor semitrailer may draw one vehicle
that is defined in Chapter 1 as special mobile equipment,
provided the overall dimension does not exceed 60 feet.

25 (4) A truck in transit may draw 3 trucks in transit26 coupled together by the triple saddlemount method.

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(5) Recreational vehicles consisting of 3 vehicles, 1 provided the following: 2

(A) The total overall dimension does not exceed 60 3 feet. 4

5 (B) The towing vehicle is a properly registered vehicle capable of towing another vehicle using a 6 7 fifth-wheel type assembly.

(C) The second vehicle in the combination of 8 9 vehicles is a recreational vehicle that is towed by a 10 fifth-wheel assembly. This vehicle must be properly 11 registered and must be equipped with brakes, 12 regardless of weight.

13 (D) The third vehicle must be the lightest of the 3 14 vehicles and be a trailer or semitrailer designed or 15 used for transporting a boat, all-terrain vehicle, 16 personal watercraft, or motorcycle.

17 (E) The towed vehicles may be only for the use of the operator of the towing vehicle. 18

19 (F) All vehicles must be properly equipped with 20 operating brakes and safety equipment required by this Code, except the additional brake requirement in 21 22 subdivision (C) of this subparagraph (5).

23 (6) A tow truck in combination with a disabled vehicle or combination of disabled vehicles, provided the towing 24 25 vehicle:

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(A) Is specifically designed as a tow truck having

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a gross vehicle weight rating of at least 18,000 pounds 1 and equipped with air brakes, provided that air brakes 2 3 are required only if the towing vehicle is towing a vehicle, semitrailer, or tractor-trailer combination 4 5 that is equipped with air brakes. For the purpose of 6 this subsection, gross vehicle weight rating, or GVWR, 7 means the value specified by the manufacturer as the loaded weight of the tow truck. 8

9 (B) Is equipped with flashing, rotating, or 10 oscillating amber lights, visible for at least 500 feet 11 in all directions.

12 (C) Is capable of utilizing the lighting and
13 braking systems of the disabled vehicle or combination
14 of vehicles.

(D) Does not engage a tow exceeding 50 highway
miles from the initial point of wreck or disablement to
a place of repair. Any additional movement of the
vehicles may occur only upon issuance of authorization
for that movement under the provisions of Sections
15-301 through 15-319 of this Code.

The Department may by rule or regulation prescribe additional requirements regarding length limitations for a tow truck towing another vehicle.

For purposes of this Section, a tow-dolly that merely serves as substitute wheels for another legally licensed vehicle is considered part of the licensed vehicle and not SB0051 Engrossed - 7 - LRB100 00048 AXK 10049 b

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2 (7) Commercial vehicles consisting of 3 vehicles,
 3 provided the following:

(A) The total overall dimension does not exceed 65 feet.

6 (B) The towing vehicle is a properly registered 7 vehicle capable of towing another vehicle using a 8 fifth-wheel type assembly or a goose-neck hitch ball.

9 (C) The third vehicle must be the lightest of the 3 10 vehicles and be a trailer or semitrailer.

(D) All vehicles must be properly equipped with
operating brakes and safety equipment required by this
Code.

14 (E) The combination of vehicles must be operated by15 a person who holds a commercial driver's license (CDL).

16 (F) The combination of vehicles must be en route to 17 a location where new or used trailers are sold by an 18 Illinois or out-of-state licensed new or used trailer 19 dealer.

20 (c-1) A combination of 3 vehicles is allowed access to any
21 State designated highway if:

(1) the length of neither towed vehicle exceeds 28.5feet;

(2) the overall wheel base of the combination of
 vehicles does not exceed 62 feet; and

26 (3) the combination of vehicles is en route to a

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1 2 location where new or used trailers are sold by an Illinois or out-of-state licensed new or used trailer dealer.

3 (c-2) A combination of 3 vehicles is allowed access from 4 any State designated highway onto any county, township, or 5 municipal highway for a distance of 5 highway miles for the 6 purpose of delivery or collection of one or both of the towed 7 vehicles if:

8 (1) the length of neither towed vehicle exceeds 28.5
9 feet;

10 (2) the combination of vehicles does not exceed 40,000
 11 pounds in gross weight and 8 feet 6 inches in width;

12

(3) there is no sign prohibiting that access;

13 (4) the route is not being used as a thoroughfare14 between State designated highways; and

(5) the combination of vehicles is en route to a
location where new or used trailers are sold by an Illinois
or out-of-state licensed new or used trailer dealer.

18 (d) On Class I highways there are no overall length 19 limitations on motor vehicles operating in combinations 20 provided:

(1) The length of a semitrailer, unladen or with load,
in combination with a truck tractor may not exceed 53 feet.

(2) The distance between the kingpin and the center of
the rear axle of a semitrailer longer than 48 feet, in
combination with a truck tractor, may not exceed 45 feet 6
inches. The limit contained in this paragraph (2) shall not

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apply to trailers or semi-trailers used for the transport
 of livestock as defined by Section 18b-101.

(3) The length of a semitrailer or trailer, unladen or
with load, operated in a truck tractor-semitrailer-trailer
or truck tractor semitrailer-semitrailer combination, may
not exceed 28 feet 6 inches.

7 (4) Maxi-cube combinations, as defined in Chapter 1,
8 may not exceed 65 feet overall dimension.

9 (5) Combinations of vehicles specifically designed to 10 transport motor vehicles or boats may not exceed 65 feet 11 overall dimension. The length limitation is inclusive of 12 front and rear bumpers but exclusive of the overhang of the 13 transported vehicles, as provided in paragraph (i) of this 14 Section.

15 (6) Stinger-steered Stinger steered semitrailer 16 vehicles specifically designed to transport motor vehicles 17 or boats and automobile transporters, as defined in Chapter 1, may not exceed 80 feet overall dimension. The length 18 limitation is inclusive of front and rear bumpers but 19 20 exclusive of the overhang of the transported vehicles, as 21 provided in paragraph (i) of this Section.

(7) A truck in transit transporting 3 trucks coupled
 together by the triple saddlemount method may not exceed 97
 feet overall dimension.

(8) A towaway trailer transporter combination may not
 exceed 82 feet overall dimension.

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Vehicles operating during daylight hours when transporting 1 2 poles, pipes, machinery, or other objects of a structural nature that cannot readily be dismembered are exempt from 3 length limitations, provided that no object may exceed 80 feet 4 5 in length and the overall dimension of the vehicle including the load may not exceed 100 feet. This exemption does not apply 6 7 to operation on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday. Legal 8 holidays referred to in this Section are the days on which the 9 following traditional holidays are celebrated: New Year's Day; Memorial Day; Independence Day; Labor Day; Thanksgiving Day; 10 11 and Christmas Day.

Vehicles and loads operated by a public utility while en route to make emergency repairs to public service facilities or properties are exempt from length limitations, provided that during night operations every vehicle and its load must be equipped with a sufficient number of clearance lamps on both sides and marker lamps on the extreme ends of any projecting load to clearly mark the dimensions of the load.

Section 5-35 of the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act
relating to procedures for rulemaking shall not apply to the

7 (e) On Class II highways there are no overall length 8 limitations on motor vehicles operating in combinations, 9 provided:

10 (1) The length of a semitrailer, unladen or with load,
11 in combination with a truck tractor, may not exceed 53 feet
12 overall dimension.

13 (2) The distance between the kingpin and the center of 14 the rear axle of a semitrailer longer than 48 feet, in 15 combination with a truck tractor, may not exceed 45 feet 6 16 inches. The limit contained in this paragraph (2) shall not 17 apply to trailers or semi-trailers used for the transport 18 of livestock as defined by Section 18b-101.

19 (3) A truck tractor-semitrailer-trailer or truck
20 tractor semitrailer-semitrailer combination may not exceed
21 65 feet in dimension from front axle to rear axle.

(4) The length of a semitrailer or trailer, unladen or
with load, operated in a truck tractor-semitrailer-trailer
or truck tractor semitrailer-semitrailer combination, may
not exceed 28 feet 6 inches.

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(5) Maxi-cube combinations, as defined in Chapter 1,

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may not exceed 65 feet overall dimension.

(6) A combination of vehicles, specifically designed
to transport motor vehicles or boats, may not exceed 65
feet overall dimension. The length limitation is inclusive
of front and rear bumpers but exclusive of the overhang of
the transported vehicles, as provided in paragraph (i) of
this Section.

8 (7) <u>Stinger-steered</u> <del>Stinger steered</del> semitrailer 9 vehicles specifically designed to transport motor vehicles 10 or boats, may not exceed 80 feet overall dimension. The 11 length limitation is inclusive of front and rear bumpers 12 but exclusive of the overhang of the transported vehicles, 13 as provided in paragraph (i) of this Section.

14 (8) A truck in transit transporting 3 trucks coupled
15 together by the triple saddlemount method may not exceed 97
16 feet overall dimension.

17 (9) A towaway trailer transporter combination may not18 exceed 82 feet overall dimension.

19 Vehicles operating during daylight hours when transporting 20 poles, pipes, machinery, or other objects of a structural nature that cannot readily be dismembered are exempt from 21 22 length limitations, provided that no object may exceed 80 feet 23 in length and the overall dimension of the vehicle including the load may not exceed 100 feet. This exemption does not apply 24 25 to operation on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday. Legal 26 holidays referred to in this Section are the days on which the

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following traditional holidays are celebrated: New Year's Day;
 Memorial Day; Independence Day; Labor Day; Thanksgiving Day;

18 The length limitations described in this paragraph (e) 19 shall be exclusive of safety and energy conservation devices, 20 such as bumpers, refrigeration units or air compressors and 21 other devices, that the Department may interpret as necessary 22 for safe and efficient operation; except that no device 23 excluded under this paragraph shall have by its design or use 24 the capability to carry cargo.

2 (e-1) Combinations of vehicles not exceeding 65 feet
3 overall length are allowed access as follows:

4 (1) From any State designated highway onto any county,
5 township, or municipal highway for a distance of 5 highway
6 miles for the purpose of loading and unloading, provided:

7 (A) The vehicle does not exceed 80,000 pounds in
8 gross weight and 8 feet 6 inches in width.

9

(B) There is no sign prohibiting that access.

10 (C) The route is not being used as a thoroughfare11 between State designated highways.

12 (2) From any State designated highway onto any county 13 or township highway for a distance of 5 highway miles or 14 onto any municipal highway for a distance of one highway 15 mile for the purpose of food, fuel, repairs, and rest, 16 provided:

17 (A) The vehicle does not exceed 80,000 pounds in
18 gross weight and 8 feet 6 inches in width.

19

(B) There is no sign prohibiting that access.

20 (C) The route is not being used as a thoroughfare
21 between State designated highways.

(e-2) Except as provided in subsection (e-3), combinations of vehicles over 65 feet in length, with no overall length limitation except as provided in subsections (d) and (e) of this Section, are allowed access as follows:

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(1) From a Class I highway onto any street or highway

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for a distance of one highway mile for the purpose of loading, unloading, food, fuel, repairs, and rest, provided there is no sign prohibiting that access.

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4 (2) From a Class I or Class II highway onto any State
5 highway or any locally designated highway for a distance of
6 5 highway miles for the purpose of loading, unloading,
7 food, fuel, repairs, and rest.

8 (e-3) Combinations of vehicles over 65 feet in length 9 operated by household goods carriers or towaway trailer 10 transporter combinations, with no overall length limitations 11 except as provided in subsections (d) and (e) of this Section, 12 have unlimited access to points of loading, unloading, or 13 delivery to or from a manufacturer, distributor, or dealer.

14 (f) On Class III and other non-designated State highways, 15 the length limitations for vehicles in combination are as 16 follows:

17 (1)Truck tractor-semitrailer combinations, must comply with either a maximum 55 feet overall wheel base or 18 19 a maximum 65 feet extreme overall dimension. An agency or 20 instrumentality of the State of Illinois or any unit of local government shall not be required to widen or 21 22 otherwise alter a Class III or other non-designated State 23 highway constructed before the effective date of this 24 amendatory Act of the 100th General Assembly to accommodate 25 truck tractor-semitrailer combinations under this 26 paragraph (1).

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(2) Semitrailers, unladen or with load, may not exceed
 53 feet overall dimension.

3 (3) No truck tractor-semitrailer-trailer or truck
4 tractor semitrailer-semitrailer combination may exceed 60
5 feet extreme overall dimension.

6 (4) The distance between the kingpin and the center 7 axle of a semitrailer longer than 48 feet, in combination 8 with a truck tractor, may not exceed 42 feet 6 inches. The 9 limit contained in this paragraph (4) shall not apply to 10 trailers or semi-trailers used for the transport of 11 livestock as defined by Section 18b-101.

12 (g) Length limitations in the preceding subsections of this13 Section 15-107 do not apply to the following:

14 (1) Vehicles operated in the daytime, except on 15 Saturdays, Sundays, or legal holidays, when transporting 16 poles, pipe, machinery, or other objects of a structural 17 nature that cannot readily be dismembered, provided the overall length of vehicle and load may not exceed 100 feet 18 19 no object exceeding 80 feet in length may be and 20 transported unless a permit has been obtained as authorized in Section 15-301. 21

(2) Vehicles and loads operated by a public utility
while en route to make emergency repairs to public service
facilities or properties, but during night operation every
vehicle and its load must be equipped with a sufficient
number of clearance lamps on both sides and marker lamps

upon the extreme ends of any projecting load to clearly
 mark the dimensions of the load.

3 (3) A tow truck in combination with a disabled vehicle
4 or combination of disabled vehicles, provided the towing
5 vehicle meets the following conditions:

6 (A) It is specifically designed as a tow truck 7 having a gross vehicle weight rating of at least 18,000 8 pounds and equipped with air brakes, provided that air 9 brakes are required only if the towing vehicle is 10 towing a vehicle, semitrailer, or tractor-trailer 11 combination that is equipped with air brakes.

(B) It is equipped with flashing, rotating, or
oscillating amber lights, visible for at least 500 feet
in all directions.

15 (C) It is capable of utilizing the lighting and
16 braking systems of the disabled vehicle or combination
17 of vehicles.

18 (D) It does not engage in a tow exceeding 50 miles
19 from the initial point of wreck or disablement.

The Department may by rule or regulation prescribe additional requirements regarding length limitations for a tow truck towing another vehicle. The towing vehicle, however, may tow any disabled vehicle from the initial point of wreck or disablement to a point where repairs are actually to occur. This movement shall be valid only on State routes. The tower must abide by posted bridge weight limits. SB0051 Engrossed - 18 - LRB100 00048 AXK 10049 b

For the purpose of this subsection, gross vehicle weight rating, or GVWR, shall mean the value specified by the manufacturer as the loaded weight of the tow truck. Legal holidays referred to in this Section shall be specified as the day on which the following traditional holidays are celebrated:

6 New Year's Day;

7 Memorial Day;

8 Independence Day;

9 Labor Day;

10 Thanksgiving Day; and

11 Christmas Day.

12 (h) The load upon any vehicle operated alone, or the load 13 upon the front vehicle of a combination of vehicles, shall not extend more than 3 feet beyond the front wheels of the vehicle 14 15 or the front bumper of the vehicle if it is equipped with a 16 front bumper. The provisions of this subsection (h) shall not 17 apply to any vehicle or combination of vehicles specifically designed for the collection and transportation of waste, 18 19 garbage, or recyclable materials during the vehicle's 20 operation in the course of collecting garbage, waste, or recyclable materials if the vehicle is traveling at a speed not 21 22 in excess of 15 miles per hour during the vehicle's operation 23 and in the course of collecting garbage, waste, or recyclable materials. However, in no instance shall the load extend more 24 25 than 7 feet beyond the front wheels of the vehicle or the front 26 bumper of the vehicle if it is equipped with a front bumper.

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The load upon the front vehicle of an automobile 1 (i) 2 transporter or a stinger-steered vehicle specifically designed to transport motor vehicles shall not extend more than 4 feet 3 beyond the foremost part of the transporting vehicle and the 4 5 load upon the rear transporting vehicle shall not extend more than 6 feet beyond the rear of the bed or body of the vehicle. 6 This paragraph shall only be applicable upon highways 7 8 designated in paragraphs (d) and (e) of this Section.

9 (j) Articulated vehicles comprised of 2 sections, neither 10 of which exceeds a length of 42 feet, designed for the carrying 11 of more than 10 persons, may be up to 60 feet in length, not 12 including energy absorbing bumpers, provided that the vehicles 13 are:

operated by or for any public body or motor carrier
 authorized by law to provide public transportation
 services; or

2. operated in local public transportation service by
any other person and the municipality in which the service
is to be provided approved the operation of the vehicle.

(k) Any person who is convicted of violating this Section is subject to the penalty as provided in paragraph (b) of Section 15-113.
