S1147 RUIZ

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AN ACT authorizing municipalities to impose taxes on the storage
 of empty shipping containers, and supplementing P.L.1970,
 c.326 (C.40:48C-1 et seq.).

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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8 1. a. The governing body of a municipality may provide, by 9 ordinance, for the imposition and collection of a tax on empty ISO 10 shipping containers stored within the municipality, at the rates and 11 in the manner provided by ordinance.

12 b. As used in this section:

"ISO shipping container" or "ISO container" means any 13 14 standardized shipping container constructed in accordance with the 15 standard sizes promulgated by the International Standards 16 Organization for use in intermodal transportation of goods by ship, 17 rail or truck, which shall include but shall not be limited to containers that are 20 feet in length and 8 feet in width, 40 feet in 18 19 length and 8 feet in width, 45 feet in length and 8 feet in width, 48 20 feet in length and 8 feet in width, and 53 feet in length and 8 feet in 21 width;

c. All taxes collected by a municipality pursuant to this section
shall be remitted to the chief financial officer of the municipality,
who shall:

(1) deposit 75% of the amounts collected in a trust account
established by the municipality and dedicated exclusively for the
purpose of funding infrastructure projects within the municipality,
and

29 (2) remit 25% of the amounts collected to the chief financial 30 officer of the county within which the municipality is located. The 31 chief financial officer of the county shall deposit those amounts in a 32 trust account established by the county and dedicated for the 33 purpose of funding either infrastructure projects within the 34 municipality which collected the tax, or for the acquisition or 35 maintenance of open space within the municipality which collected 36 the tax.

d. The Director of the Division of Local Government Services
in the Department of Community Affairs, in consultation with the
Director of the Division of Taxation in the Department of the
Treasury, shall, within 60 days of the date of enactment of this act,
adopt a model ordinance to aid municipal governing bodies
considering the imposition and collection of a tax on empty ISO
shipping containers pursuant to this section.
