A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the implementation by the Texas Department of Transportation of a vehicle mileage user fee pilot program and a 3 task force to assist in developing and evaluating the program. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 201, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Subchapter Z to read as follows: 7 SUBCHAPTER Z. VEHICLE MILEAGE USER FEE PILOT PROGRAM 8 Sec. 201.2101. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 9 (1) "Motor fuel taxes" means the motor fuel taxes 10 11 imposed under Chapter 162, Tax Code. 12 (2) "Pilot program" means the vehicle mileage user fee 13 pilot program. 14 (3) "Task force" means the vehicle mileage user fee 15 task force. 16 Sec. 201.2102. TASK FORCE. (a) The vehicle mileage user fee task force is established to guide the development and 17 evaluation of the vehicle mileage user fee pilot program to assess 18 the potential for mileage-based revenue as an alternative to the 19 current system of taxing highway use through motor fuel taxes. 20 21 (b) The task force shall consist of seven members appointed 22 as follows: 23 (1) one member appointed by the lieutenant governor; 24 (2) one member appointed by the speaker of the house of

No. 3418 1 representatives; 2 (3) one member appointed by the chair of the standing committee of the house of representatives having primary 3 jurisdiction over transportation; 4 5 (4) one member appointed by the chair of the standing 6 committee of the senate having primary jurisdiction over 7 transportation; and (5) three members that represent the trucking 8 industry, appointed by the governor. 9 10 (c) The task force shall: (1) conduct at least three public hearings to gather 11 12 public comment on issues and concerns related to the pilot program; (2) make recommendations to the department on the 13 14 design and on the criteria to be used to evaluate the pilot program 15 and other alternative approaches to motor fuel taxes; and 16 (3) evaluate the pilot program. 17 (d) In conducting hearings under Subsection (c)(1), the task force shall: 18 19 (1) provide notice: 20 (A) in the manner provided by Chapter 551, 21 Government Code; and 22 (B) on the department's Internet website; and 23 (2) provide interested persons with an opportunity to 24 submit their opinions orally and in writing. 25 (e) The department may create and maintain an Internet 26 website to allow members of the public to submit comments 27 electronically.

1 (f) On request, the department shall assist the task force 2 in implementing this subchapter. Sec. 201.2103. PILOT PROGRAM. (a) The department, in 3 consultation with the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles and the 4 Texas A&M Transportation Institute, shall develop and implement a 5 statewide pilot program to assess a user fee on owners of motor 6 7 vehicles that is based on the number of miles traveled on public 8 highways in this state by those vehicles. 9 (b) The pilot program must: (1) include not more than 800 motor vehicles, the 10 mileage of which will be measured by a variety of 11 12 vehicle-mileage-counting strategies, including odometer readings, administered in a manner the department considers appropriate; 13 (2) test the reliability, ease of use, cost, and 14 15 public acceptance of technology and methods for: 16 (A) counting the number of miles traveled by 17 motor vehicles; (B) reporting the number of miles traveled by 18 19 particular vehicles; and 20 (C) collecting payments from participants in the 21 pilot program; 22 (3) analyze and evaluate the ability of different technologies and methods to: 23 24 (A) protect the integrity of data collected and 25 reported; 26 (B) ensure operators' privacy; and 27 (C) vary pricing based on the time of driving and

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1	type of public highway; and
2	(4) evaluate:
3	(A) the enforceability of the vehicle mileage
4	user fee and opportunities for operators to evade or manipulate the
5	fee; and
6	(B) the impact of the vehicle mileage user fee on
7	equity.
8	(c) The department shall ensure that participants in the
9	pilot program:
10	(1) are included only on a voluntary basis; and
11	(2) represent a variety of motor vehicle operators,
12	including operators of passenger vehicles, commercial motor
13	vehicles, and electric vehicles.
14	(d) The pilot program may not last less than one year.
15	Sec. 201.2104. COMPENSATION OF PARTICIPANTS. The
16	department by rule shall establish a process to ensure that
17	participants in the pilot program are not required to spend more on
18	fees or taxes associated with road usage than if they had not
19	participated in the program. A process adopted under this section
20	may include a refund of motor fuel taxes paid by the participant or
21	other compensation.
22	Sec. 201.2105. CONFIDENTIALITY OF INFORMATION.
23	Identifying information about participants in the pilot program is
24	confidential and is not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552,
25	Government Code.
26	Sec. 201.2106. REPORT. Not later than September 1, 2026,
27	the department shall submit to the legislature a report summarizing

1 the results of the pilot program, including: 2 (1) the feasibility of permanently assessing a vehicle 3 mileage user fee; 4 (2) an evaluation of the impacts of a vehicle mileage 5 user fee on the economy, the environment, and traffic congestion; 6 (3) a comparison to other alternative approaches or 7 supplements to motor fuel taxes; and 8 (4) the department's recommendations together with suggested legislation necessary to implement the recommendations. 9 Sec. 201.2107. APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL FUNDING. 10 The department shall submit an application to the United States 11 Department of Transportation for funding in federal fiscal year 12 2023 for the Surface Transportation System Funding Alternatives 13 14 Program established in the Fixing America's Surface Transportation 15 Act (Pub. L. No. 114-94) to help fund the pilot program. If the application is not successful, the department shall apply in each 16 17 federal fiscal year in which grants are made available for demonstration projects under this federal program or until the 18 application results in full or partial funding for a vehicle 19 mileage user fee pilot program, whichever first occurs. 20 21 Sec. 201.2108. EXPIRATION OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter expires November 1, 2026. 22

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SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
