1	AN ACT concerning commercial driver licenses and supplementing
2	Title 39 of the Revised Statutes.

4	BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5	of New Jersey:
6	
7	1. a. The New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, in
8	consultation with experts in the commercial trucking industry, shall
9	establish a program to increase the number of young drivers who
10	possess a commercial driver license. The program shall:
11	(1) assist young drivers in obtaining a commercial driver
12	license;
13	(2) raise awareness about the benefits of holding a commercial
14	driver license and otherwise encourage young drivers to obtain a
15	commercial driver license;
16	(3) coordinate with members of the commercial trucking
17	industry to recruit those drivers for employment opportunities; and
18	(4) engage in any other activities that the Chief Administrator of
19	the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission deems to be appropriate
20	to fulfill the purposes of this act.
21	b. The commission shall include information on the program in
22	the commission's annual report, including data on the number of
23	young drivers that participated in the program in the most recent
24	12-month period, data on the number of young drivers who have
25	obtained a commercial driver license, employment, or both under
26	the program in the most recent 12-month period, and any other
27	information that the chief administrator deems to be appropriate.

29	2. This act shall take effect immediately.

32	STATEMENT
33	
34	This bill requires the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission to
35	establish a program to increase the number of young drivers who
36	possess a commercial driver license. The program is to be
37	established in consultation with experts in the commercial trucking
38	industry. The commission is required to include information on the

program in its annual report.
