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Sec. 5. <u>APPROPRIATION</u>; <u>COMMERCIAL DRIVER TRAINING ASSISTANCE</u> PROGRAM.

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- (a) \$6,000,000 in fiscal year 2026 is appropriated from the general fund to the
 commissioner of transportation for the commercial driver training assistance program under
 Minnesota Statutes, section 171.45. This is a onetime appropriation and is available until
 June 30, 2028.
- (b) The commissioner may expend money in the driver and vehicle services technology
 account in the special revenue fund for information systems purposes related to the
 commercial driver training assistance program.
