AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in
relation to providing
for the suspension of a commercial driver's
license if a driver has
been convicted of a violation of local laws
relating to a designated
system of truck routes

The People of the State of New York, represented
in Senate and Assem-
bly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 510-a of the
vehicle and traffic

2 law is amended by adding a new paragraph (f) to
read as follows:

3 (f) A commercial driver's license shall be
4 suspended by the commis-
sioner:

5 (i) for a period of sixty days where the holder
6 is convicted of a
7 violation of a local law, ordinance, order, rule
8 or regulation enacted
9 by the legislative body of any city, village or
10 town, pursuant to the
11 provisions of paragraph ten of subdivision
12 (a) of section sixteen
13 hundred forty or paragraph ten of subdivision (a)
14 of section sixteen
15 hundred sixty of this chapter.
16 (ii) for a period of one hundred twenty
17 days where the holder is
18 convicted of a second violation of a local law,
19 ordinance, order, rule
20 or regulation enacted by the legislative body of
21 any city, village or
22 town, pursuant to the provisions of paragraph ten
23 of subdivision (a) of
24 section sixteen hundred forty or paragraph ten
25 of subdivision (a) of
26 section sixteen hundred sixty of this chapter,
both of which were
committed within a three-year period.
 (iii) for a period of one year where the
holder is convicted of a
third violation of a local law, ordinance, order,
rule or regulation
enacted by the legislative body of any city,
village or town, pursuant
to the provisions of paragraph ten of subdivision
(a) of section sixteen
hundred forty or paragraph ten of subdivision (a)
of section sixteen
hundred sixty of this chapter, all of which
were committed within a
three-year period.

§ 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth
day after it shall
have become a law.
