LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill addresses commercial driver license (CDL) applicants.

This bill:

- requires a CDL applicant to sign a form attesting to the applicant's English language ability;
- requires reporting regarding CDL driver training schools; and
- makes technical changes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **53-3-204** is amended to read:

53-3-204 . Persons who may not be licensed.

(1)(a) The division may not license a person who:

- (i) is younger than 16 years old;
- (ii) if the person is 18 years old or younger, has not completed a course in driver

- 30 training approved by the commissioner;
- 31 (iii) if the person is 19 years old or older has not completed:
- 32 (A) a course in driver training approved by the commissioner; or
- 33 (B) the requirements under Subsection 53-3-210.5(6)(c);
- 34 (iv) if the person is a minor as defined in Section 53-3-211, has not completed the
- 35 driving requirement under Section 53-3-211;
- 36 (v) is not a resident of the state, unless the person[~~;~~]
- 37 [~~(A) is issued a temporary CDL under Subsection 53-3-407(2)(b) prior to July 1,~~
- 38 ~~2015; or~~]
- 39 [~~(B)~~] _qualifies for a non-domiciled CDL as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 383;
- 40 (vi) if the person is 17 years old or younger, has not held a learner permit issued
- 41 under Section 53-3-210.5 or an equivalent by another state or branch of the United
- 42 States Armed Forces for six months; or
- 43 (vii) is younger than 18 years old and applying for a CDL under 49 C.F.R. Part 383.
- 44 (b) Subsections (1)(a)(i), (ii), (iii), (iv), and (vi) do not apply to a person:
- 45 (i) who has been licensed before July 1, 1967; or
- 46 (ii) who is 16 years old or older making application for a license who has been
- 47 licensed in another state or country.
- 48 (2) The division may not issue a license certificate to a person:
- 49 (a) whose license has been suspended, denied, cancelled, or disqualified during the
- 50 period of suspension, denial, cancellation, or disqualification;
- 51 (b) whose privilege has been revoked, except as provided in Section 53-3-225;
- 52 (c) who has previously been adjudged mentally incompetent and who has not at the time
- 53 of application been restored to competency as provided by law;
- 54 (d) who is required by this chapter to take an examination unless the person successfully
- 55 passes the examination;
- 56 (e) whose driving privileges have been denied or suspended under:
- 57 (i) Section 80-6-707 by an order of the juvenile court; or

- 63 card is surrendered to the division.

- 64 (3)(a) Except as provided in Subsection (3)(c), the division may not grant a motorcycle
 65 endorsement to a person who:
- 66 (i) has not been granted an original or provisional class D license, a CDL, or an
 67 out-of-state equivalent to an original or provisional class D license or a CDL; and
 - 68 (ii) if the person is under 19 years old, has not held a motorcycle learner permit for
 69 two months unless Subsection (3)(b) applies.
- 70 (b) The division may waive the two month motorcycle learner permit holding period
 71 requirement under Subsection (3)(a)(ii) if the person proves to the satisfaction of the
 72 division that the person has completed a motorcycle rider education program that
 73 meets the requirements under Section 53-3-903.
- 74 (c) The division may grant a motorcycle endorsement to a person under 19 years old
 75 who has not held a motorcycle learner permit for two months if the person was issued
 76 a motorcycle endorsement prior to July 1, 2008.
- 77 (4) The division may grant a class D license to a person whose commercial license is
 78 disqualified under Part 4, Uniform Commercial Driver License Act, if the person is not
 79 otherwise sanctioned under this chapter.

81 **53-3-205 . Application for license or endorsement -- Fee required -- Tests --**
 82 **Expiration dates of licenses and endorsements -- Information required -- Previous**
 83 **licenses surrendered -- Driving record transferred from other states -- Reinstatement --**
 84 **Fee required -- License agreement.**

- 85 (1) An application for an original license, provisional license, or endorsement shall be:
 86 (a) made upon a form furnished by the division; and
 87 (b) accompanied by a nonrefundable fee set under Section 53-3-105.
- 88 (2) An application and fee for an original provisional class D license or an original class D
 89 license entitle the applicant to:
 90 (a) not more than three attempts to pass both the knowledge and the skills tests for a
 91 class D license within six months after the date of the application;
 92 (b) a learner permit if needed pending completion of the application and testing process;
 93 and
 94 (c) an original class D license and license certificate after all tests are passed and
 95 requirements are completed.
- 96 (3) An application and fee for a motorcycle or taxicab endorsement entitle the applicant to:

- 187 (Bb) is applying for a driving privilege card; or
- 188 (IV) other documentary evidence approved by the division;

190 acceptable under rules made by the division under Section 53-3-104[~~, unless~~
191 ~~the application is for a temporary CDL issued under Subsection 53-3-407(2)(b)~~];

- 193 (F) fingerprints, or a fingerprint confirmation form described in Subsection
194 53-3-205.5(1)(a)(ii), and a photograph in accordance with Section 53-3-205.5
195 if the applicant is applying for a driving privilege card;
- 196 (ii) provide evidence of the applicant's lawful presence in the United States by
197 providing documentary evidence:
- 198 (A) that the applicant is:
- 199 (I) a United States citizen;

- 200 (II) a United States national; or
201 (III) a legal permanent resident alien; or
202 (B) of the applicant's:
203 (I) unexpired immigrant or nonimmigrant visa status for admission into the
204 United States;
205 (II) pending or approved application for asylum in the United States;
206 (III) admission into the United States as a refugee;
207 (IV) pending or approved application for temporary protected status in the
208 United States;
209 (V) approved deferred action status;
210 (VI) pending application for adjustment of status to legal permanent resident or
211 conditional resident; or
212 (VII) conditional permanent resident alien status;

214 (iv) state whether the applicant has previously been licensed to drive a motor vehicle
215 and, if so, when and by what state or country;

218 license application refused, and if so, the date of and reason for the suspension,
219 cancellation, revocation, disqualification, denial, or refusal;
220 (vi) state whether the applicant intends to make an anatomical gift under Title 26B,
221 Chapter 8, Part 3, Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act, in compliance with
222 Subsection (15);
223 (vii) state whether the applicant is required to register as a sex offender, kidnap
224 offender, or child abuse offender, in accordance with Title 53, Chapter 29, Sex,
225 Kidnap, and Child Abuse Offender Registry;
226 (viii) state whether the applicant is a veteran of the United States military, provide
227 verification that the applicant was granted an honorable or general discharge from
228 the United States Armed Forces, and state whether the applicant does or does not
229 authorize sharing the information with the Department of Veterans and Military
230 Affairs;
231 (ix) provide all other information the division requires; and
232 (x) sign the application which signature may include an electronic signature as
233 defined in Section 46-4-102.

- 234 (b) Unless the applicant provides acceptable verification of homelessness as described in
235 rules made by the division, an applicant shall have a Utah residence address~~[-unless~~
236 ~~the application is for a temporary CDL issued under Subsection 53-3-407(2)(b).]~~ .
- 237 (c) An applicant shall provide evidence of lawful presence in the United States in
238 accordance with Subsection (8)(a)(ii), unless the application is for a driving privilege
239 card.
- 240 (d) The division shall maintain on the division's computerized records an applicant's:
241 (i)(A) social security number;
242 (B) temporary identification number~~[-(ITIN)]~~; or
243 (C) other number assigned by the division if Subsection (8)(a)(i)(D)(IV) applies;
244 and
245 (ii) indication whether the applicant is required to register as a sex offender, kidnap
246 offender, or child abuse offender in accordance with Title 53, Chapter 29, Sex,
247 Kidnap, and Child Abuse Offender Registry.
- 248 (9) The division shall require proof of an applicant's name, birth date, and birthplace by at
249 least one of the following means:
250 (a) current license certificate;

253 (d) other proof, including church records, family Bible notations, school records, or
254 other evidence considered acceptable by the division.
- 255 (10)(a) Except as provided in Subsection (10)(c), if an applicant receives a license in a
256 higher class than what the applicant originally was issued:

275 (b) When received, the driver's record becomes part of the driver's record in this state
276 with the same effect as though entered originally on the driver's record in this state.

277 (12) An application for reinstatement of a license after the suspension, cancellation,
278 disqualification, denial, or revocation of a previous license is accompanied by the
279 additional fee or fees specified in Section 53-3-105.

280 (13) An individual who has an appointment with the division for testing and fails to keep
281 the appointment or to cancel at least 48 hours in advance of the appointment shall pay

- 309 [(17)] (18) Notwithstanding Title 63G, Chapter 2, Government Records Access and
- 310 Management Act, the division shall, upon request, release to the ~~Sex, Kidnap, and Child~~
- 311 ~~Abuse Offender Registry office in~~ Bureau of Criminal Identification within the
- 312 Department of Public Safety, the names and addresses of all applicants who, under
- 313 Subsection (8)(a)(vii), indicate they are required to register as a sex offender, kidnap
- 314 offender, or child abuse offender in accordance with Title 53, Chapter 29, Sex, Kidnap,
- 315 and Child Abuse Offender Registry.
- 316 [(18)] (19) The division and its employees are not liable, as a result of false or inaccurate
- 317 information provided under Subsection (8)(a)(vi) or (viii), for direct or indirect:
- 318 (a) loss;
- 319 (b) detriment; or
- 320 (c) injury.
- 321 [(19)] (20) An applicant who knowingly fails to provide the information required under
- 322 Subsection (8)(a)(vii) is guilty of a class A misdemeanor.
- 323 [(20)] (21) A person may not hold both an unexpired Utah license certificate and an
- 324 unexpired identification card.
- 325 [(21)] (22)(a) An applicant who applies for an original motorcycle endorsement to a
- 326 regular license certificate is exempt from the requirement to pass the knowledge and
- 327 skills test to be eligible for the motorcycle endorsement if the applicant:
- 328 (i) is a resident of the state of Utah;
- 329 (ii)(A) is ordered to active duty and stationed outside of Utah in any of the armed
- 330 forces of the United States; or
- 331 (B) is an immediate family member or dependent of an individual described in
- 332 Subsection ~~[(21)(a)(ii)(A)]~~ (22)(a)(ii)(A) and is residing outside of Utah;
- 333 (iii) has a digitized driver license photo on file with the division;
- 334 (iv) provides proof to the division of the successful completion of a certified
- 335 Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider training course; and

- 336 (v) provides the necessary information and documentary evidence required under
 337 Subsection (8).
- 338 (b) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the
 339 division shall make rules:
- 340 (i) establishing the procedures for an individual to obtain a motorcycle endorsement
 341 under this Subsection (21); and
- 342 (ii) identifying the applicable restrictions for a motorcycle endorsement issued under
 343 this Subsection (21).

344 Section 3. Section **53-3-407** is amended to read:

345 **53-3-407 . Qualifications for commercial driver license -- Fee -- Third parties**
 346 **may administer skills test.**

- 347 (1)(a) As used in this section, "CDL driver training school" means a business enterprise
 348 conducted by an individual, association, partnership, or corporation that:
- 349 (i) educates and trains persons, either practically or theoretically, or both, to drive
 350 commercial motor vehicles; and
- 351 (ii) prepares an applicant for an examination under Subsection (2)(a)(iii).
- 352 (b) A CDL driver training school may charge a consideration or tuition for the services
 353 provided under Subsection (1)(a).
- 354 (2)(a) Except as provided in Subsection (2)(c), a CDL may be issued only to a person
 355 who:
- 356 (i) is a resident of this state or is an out-of-state resident if the person qualifies for a
 357 non-domiciled CDL as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 383;
- 358 (ii) has held a CDIP for a minimum of 14 days prior to taking the skills test under 49
 359 C.F.R. Part 383, including a person who is upgrading a CDL class or endorsement
 360 requiring a skills test under 49 C.F.R. Part 383;
- 361 (iii) has passed a test of knowledge and skills for driving a commercial motor vehicle,
 362 that complies with minimum standards established by federal regulation in 49
 363 C.F.R. Part 383, Subparts G and H; and
- 364 (iv) has complied with all requirements of 49 C.F.R. Part 383 and other applicable
 365 state laws and federal regulations.
- 366 (b) A person who applies for a CDL is exempt from the requirement to pass a skills test
 367 to be eligible for the license if the person:
- 368 (i) is a resident of the state of Utah;
- 369 (ii) has successfully completed a skills test administered by a state or a party

370 authorized by a state or jurisdiction that is compliant with 49 C.F.R. Part 383; and
371 (iii) held a valid Utah CDIP at the time the test was administered.

372 (c) The department shall waive any tests specified in this section for a commercial driver
373 license applicant who, subject to the limitations and requirements of 49 C.F.R. Sec.
374 383.77, meets all certifications required for a waiver under 49 C.F.R. Sec. 383.77 and
